- 12. Summarize 15:15-17.

- 22. What made Paul not lose heart in 4:1?
- 23. Explain Paul's point(s) in 4:2-6.
- 24. What in the world is Paul talking about when he mentions clay jars in 4:7?
- 25. What's the pattern of thought in 4:8-9?
- 26. We continue to see a contrast in 4:10-12 -- explain what Paul is talking about and why he is saying it this way.
- 27. What central point does Paul mention again in 4:13-15?

28. Another contrast/comparison is made in 4:16-18 -- explain what it is and how it fits with the rest of the chapter.
