A Sermon in Song

• We ought to view the good and the bad that we face through the lens of the identity, character, and activity of God (Job 2:10b; Phil 4:12–13).

• PHSS 100, "Our Father Forever" God is a Father who provides his children both temporary and eternal comfort.

• The joy of God's presence today prepares us for the possible loneliness tomorrow, for even we—children of God—experience grief (Ps 23:2–4; Isa 43:1–7).

• PHSS 650, "Jesus, Draw Me Ever Nearer" Jesus guides us through the storm to assure us of his presence and increase our love for him.

• Knowing that God has promised rest to his people, the presence of temptation and woe merely assure us of divine blessings to come (Matt 5:4; John 16:20).

• PHSS 373, "Be Still, My Soul" In every change, He faithful will remain.... Through thorny ways [he] leads to a joyful end.

• Our hope is that one day, regardless of the dark valleys that we must traverse here, God will welcome into his dwelling place (Ps 23:4–6; John 14:1–3).

• PHSS 754, "Sing to Me of Heaven" We ought to remind ourselves regularly of our hope of heaven, the habitation of God.

• God gives a foretaste of rest now so that when our bodies wear out from service, we may rest assured that Sabbath is ours (2 Cor 4:16–5:8; Heb 4:9–12).

• PHSS 749, "There Is a Habitation" The habitation of God is a place where we will rest from earthly labors and praise God forever.
